Remember to use the £ sign for pounds and p for pence or pennies.</p>

Write down your idea in a sentence using a capital letter, full stop and finger spaces.</p>	<p><u>Fab Fractions.</u> Can you share things in half or in quarters? Draw or find some different objects and split them into half or quarters. Label each part of the whole. Tip - Try to choose regular shapes!</p>

Write them in a list (with an adjective if you can).</p>	<p><u>Let's Be Friends</u> Lots of people think that friendship is important. Draw some of your friends and write their names with a capital letter.</p>	<p><u>Terrific Pairs to 20.</u> Design a brightly coloured poster with all your number pairs to 20. 10+10, 19+1, 18+2, etc.</p>
<p><u>Penguin Pictures</u> Draw a picture of the penguin from <i>Lost and Found</i>. Can you write the word 'penguin' with your letters in cursive handwriting.</p>	<p><u>Material World.</u> Use your fantastic collage skills to make a collage of a house using lots of different materials.</p>	<p><u>Perfect Pairs to 10.</u> Design a brightly coloured poster with all your number pairs to 10. 10+0, 9+1, 8+2, etc. Include subtraction too.</p>
